# Kim Clement From Presidents to SuperStars...

Royalty and Theologians
to the weak & dying...
and those failing in faith.

"God gave us the ability to think and reason. He also gave us the ability to sense and feel. When people tell me they have thought about reaching out to God, I tell them not to over-think, but to try sensing God in their life. He is waiting for us to love ourselves and to love Him in return. That seems little enough in return for the gift of life."

Kim Clement is a prophet of the spoken word. He is a prophet of music. He is a prophet of the people. Electrifying. Charismatic. Spectacular. Divine. And, by some institutional standards quite unorthodox. Nevertheless, Clement is on a roll to fight the devil and save the world, one soul at a time.

"I was in a nightclub and someone walked up to me and stabbed me in the chest. In my confusion, I staggered out into the street and collapsed. I remembered what an Anglican minister had said to me when I was nine years old," recounts Clement. "He said,
Jesus walks the streets still today.
One day you will need him, just
call on him and he will touch you."

That was the defining moment for Clement. That fateful night back in 1974, as he lay dying on a street in Port Elizabeth, South Africa, scores of people passed him by. Then, a stranger out of the night appeared, picked him up and drove him to a hospital. From that point on there was no turning back for Clement, whose hard partying days had left him fighting the demon heroine.

Kim Clement was reborn. He was 19 years old.

Born and raised in South Africa, Clement's love for music at a young age launched an extensive training in classical studies, leading to a finalist position in the South African National Yamaha Music Competition. By 18, he had written the musical score and appeared in the Australian film, A Winter's Tale.

His musical roots were classical, but a turn-of-fate accident left him in the hospital with two broken hands and plenty of time to re-think his choice of song. His

decision: Shake the rafters and bring the people to their feet in joyous celebration.

Clement's spirited communion/musical evocations unite audiences with heartfelt spontaneity, prophetic lyrics, blazing guitars, pounding drums and some serious keyboard action-not to mention dynamo back-up singers with voices of angels. The combined effort Clement puts forth is enough to exorcise any demon, bad habit or self-doubt in the entire crowd. Exactly the effect he's going for!

"Music and the Word are all God's spiritual poetry...fragrances of God's knowledge and thoughts...his passions. When some think of prophecy, of God or the spirit communicating

with us, they don't relate it with music," he says. "But people feel connected by music...music is universal. There is never an enemy in music; especially when you are singing to God. Music adds to unity."

During the late 70s, Clement worked tirelessly throughout South Africa functioning as a music director, youth minister and drug rehab counselor at various churches and youth centers. He also worked with handi-capped children, using his music as a gateway to assist them in learning.

In 1981, Clement visited the United States to attend Christ for the Nations and by 1991 had moved his family to Texas. He now lives in Santa Barbara with his wife Jane Elizabeth and their five children. Clement travels the world on a journey of theology. His words are firmly grounded in both the Old and New Testament and his mission is to break the cycles of hurt, pain and shame that go hand in hand with the hardships, heartbreaks and tragedies we suffer in life. Crossing cultural barriers and theocratic circles. Clement has shown by his own mistakes and triumphs that our ability to progress in life demands courage and vision in our own destiny.

Known as the Singing Prophet— Clement carries forth aspects of future events with foreknowledge and foresight inspired by God. He reaches out in song and verse to lift people to a higher place with hope, enrichment and healing of haunting memories.

Each week, Clement appears on the Trinity Broadcasting Network (TBN) as the host of his own show The Prophet and is a sought after television/radio guest across the globe. His private audiences

have included four presidents, a leglong list of celebrities, corporate giants and blue collar workers all looking to him for God's truth and vision.

Clement speaks to people in all venues: at schools, clinics and grand auditoriums. From the Rose Bowl to prisons and private audiences behind closed doors with dignitaries and religious leaders around the world. Clement's role of prophet inspires millions, as he shares his visions to help us fulfill our destiny. What that destiny is-

lies in faith in God and belief in ourselves.

"Our destiny is in our relationship with God. When God reveals our destiny, He guides us away from yesterday's pain so we can see our future," he states. "God engages in a battle against our past pain by presenting a future plan. By moving towards this plan, we achieve the fulfillment we were created to experience."

As we speak, Clement is in the process of building a prayer facility in Los Angeles to serve as a homebase for his ministry: Secrets, The House of The Prophet. From this center, Clement will conduct his prophetic prayer gatherings and music revivals. Many have come forward to help with monetary donations and prayer support. Clement is hoping this prayer auditorium will offer faith and hope and, serve those who have not witnessed the power of the word of God.

ST: Why SECRETS?

KC: It's been the feel that prophets were first to hear God's secrets. That's why I took the name secrets. When you come to our meetings there are things the spirit shares with me for all to hear—good news. That doesn't mean challenges or bad things won't happen. But future events I reveal to people about their lives is also about controlling fear and progressing with direction toward their destiny. People have to come and judge for themselves. Support us. Tell their friends what they see, and help us in our ministry to spread the word that there is a place to go to hear God's voice.

ST: Some doubt the word prophet.
KC: People have sought psychics for centuries for information and comfort. I think they should also have the opportunity to hear a prophet. Unfortunately, there is a stigma attached and a misrepresentation of a prophet's gift. Many envision an old man pointing his finger and telling of the end of the world. Prophets see beyond present circumstances, with access to future events. You cannot do this without a glimpse in to the future. Jesus has always guided his people with prophets who reveal, warn and guide with divine vision. Prophets are instruments of God.

ST: I was—as most people must be taken back by the fact that during your prayer gatherings, you compose lyrics on the spot as you on along

on the spot as you go along.

KC: That is a unique part of our prayer gatherings. I've been with these musicians for 11 years. We've been challenged over and over by musicians who come to hear us and say what we are doing is impossible. Most think our music is or has been recorded and find it hard to believe that our music is as spontaneous as the prayers offered each night. Most religion is predictable and you know exactly what is going to happen in the services minute to minute. I decided from the beginning that if God wanted to use me, then, I'd create a non-predictable environment of prayer and song. This kind of atmosphere creates a chemistry between myself and the people. They know we are up there relying on faith for words and out of it comes the most beautiful songs.

ST: Everyone has a moment of truth. transition. What about those who don't know where God is or where to go for help? KC: We have different levels of pain and conflict. The beautiful thing about God is that He knows when to present himself. I believe it's our choice when He comes. One of the biggest enemies in communicating with God is presupposition. We presuppose that this is how our problems will be solved. And when it's not done that way, we get angry. But God speaks as if we're already where we are suppose to be. Although it's difficult, we cannot question God about our current circumstances because another season is already coming into our lives.
