

For more than 30 years, Tami Lynn has lived in the Hollywood spotlight. Legendary for making the ground quake while negotiating with her attorney, Henry Holmes, breakneck contracts between Studio bigwigs and clients she represents; Lynn is talented, her expertise in the field of Personal Management made her Executive Director and Founder of the National Conference of Personal Managers Western Division, and President of the Conference Of Personal Managers. She has earned a name in the entertainment industry for behind the scenes excellence on numerous television series, documentaries and numerous big screen projects. Lynn is presently working with Writer/Producer/Director Verne Nobles, and actor Lui Leung Wai, as Executive Director of the Children's Entertainment and Educational Science Showcase

Center for the Pangea Island Theme Parks. No shrinking violet in front of the camera either, in addition to her current laundry list of film projects that she is producing on her 24/7 agenda—one in particular, is very close to her heart. A breast cancer survivor, Lynn is gaining national recognition from Washington to Sacramento, with her lobby to find proper education, support and fashionable attire for other cancer survivors.

Tami Lynn started her own Personal Management Company in 1968. Her name is attached to the biggest stars, on the biggest television series made: The Brady Bunch; One Day At A Time; Eight Is Enough; The Bad News Bears; The Waltons; Dynasty; Heart Of The

City; Married, With Children; Jesse— the list is endless.

With hundreds of clients doing hundreds of television commercials, starring & guest roles on a weekly series, movies of the week and feature films at the same time, the one thing Lynn could always count on was spending end less amount of time on a plane and on the set wait ing for a client. Hence, a fashionable plan was hatched.

Born in Chicago, Lynn spent part of her childhood in New Orleans. When she was 10 years old, her parents moved the family, with her brother and sister to Los Angeles and, not a minute too soon for this budding Hollywoodster, who couldn't wait to plant roots in Tinseltown. Although Lynn's father was a well-known night club pianist. who enjoyed a celebrated career, he discouraged his daughter from taking the showbiz plunge. Lynn gave no notice and stayed on track to find her Hollywood niche.

'No way did my father want me in the entertainment business. But my mom was my rock and encouraged me," stated Lynn. The fire was burning, I just did not know what for. After college, Lynn accepted a job, at the Russ Larson Drama Studio, in North Hollywood teaching young schoolersher first taste of behind the scenes action

she loved it! In time she opened her own drama school and Personal Management Company and her star was launched.

"I had an eye for kids destined for stardom..could pick them out of a crowd every time, she says. There are those few who have it... they're on! It's like they walk in, flip a switch and the room lights up." By her fifth year, there wasn't a casting director in Hollywood, who didn't have her number on their speed dial and business was booming! At one point she had 80 commercials running at the same time. As easy as she made it seem, however, Lynn's job was no day at the

beach. It was a demanding and non-stop. A Manager is different than an Agent. Managers provide every area of a client's career, making certain they have whatever they need to focus on success. Managers work 24/7, weekends, holidays doesn't matter. Agents negotiate contacts. Then, they're finished until the next job. Years of floating between times zones, observing actors, clients and people on sets, Lynn had a vision that not only changed her life,

but the lives of thousands of others.

The idea for The ORIGINAL CHAPONY TAIL hats was born from watching women, men and children look for ways to hide their hair under a cap," Lynn says. "Whether their hair was messy and they wanted to make it fashionably unnoticeable, or were trying to stay warm, the look was the same. Unflattering. People with long hair looked the worst.

They jammed their hair into caps and there was this giant lopsided blob inside the cap. It looked awful. I knew there had to be a better solution." There was. Lynn came up with an idea to design a trendy 'beanie-like hand knitted hat, with an opening to pull through hair into a ponytail. She assembled a professional knitting team to accomplish her goal. It took months for Lynn to approve a model worthy for the hand-knitted caps. Some might think designing a cap with an opening for a ponytail is not rocket scientist work, Lynn's team worked as if it was.

"I was use to sitting in a room with 20 xecutives, battling it out with attorneys. Designing this hat was fun," Lynn states. "I'd never been in a yarn shop in my life nor did I know anything about stitching, but I found people who did. I didn't want thin stitching. I wanted beautiful thick, warm cozy stitching, with no seams showing.

In 1991, Lynn got thrown for a loop with a devastating diagnosis; Breast cancer. Physicians agreed that she needed a mastectomy. Unwilling to accept such a drastic sentence without looking into alternative treatments that might allow her to keep her breast, Lynn took her case and put her producing research into gear. She took the road less traveled and researched physicians offering options other than mastectomy

"I found out the day before Christmas 1991, in a routine exam. I was a wreck. I eat well, exercise, and no one in my family had breast cancer," Lynn says. "I knew it was stressrelated. The biopsy was Intraductal Carcinoma cancer in the ducts. Losing my breast scared me and radiation scared me. I didn't know where to turn.

Then, I found a female Oncologist who said there was a procedure called 'Subcutaneous Mastectomy' a process that has been around since the 60s. An incision is made under the breast, tissue is removed, and in cases, as mine, the nipple is saved. The incision is closed and you go home to rest and allow your breast to heal. Next, breast implants are inserted. My results are natural and undetectable as if I never had an operation. Of course, this might not be a choice for everyone, but for me, it made the difference. One thing I want women to know is not to take the first diagnosis given, for any illness. Every woman has a right to inquire about alternative options with regard to treatment, especially when surgery is recommended. Women should feel guilt-free and without pressure, as I did, from doctors or nurses who may see such proactive action as an insult to their medical expertise."

Today, Lynn is cancer free and her experience shed light on many things. One, a very special addition to her CHAPONY TAIL Hat line is: 'THE HOPE HAT' for

"My experience with cancer opened many doors and brought many wonderful people into my life," Lynn says. "Family has always been a priority to me. I was raised in a very strong Italian Catholic family. We were taught to take care of the family...that it is number one. For 28 years, Lynn has been married to multi-Emmy Award winner renowned veteran journalist, Kim Marriner, who anchors the news on KNX Radio. They have two amazing children—the sun in both their universe. Shane Butterworth from Lynn's first marriage, is a working actor

claiming his own amid Hollywood goo and glam. Shane is best known for his role as Lupus, in "The Bad News Bears". And as Lynn, says, a complete health buff whose expertise as a personal trainer has whipped many budding stars into tip-top shape. Their daughter Kassie, is a student at Pierce College and happens to sideline as a model in her mother's Chapony Tail brochures. Both sister and brother are picture perfect—and appear in national Chapony Tail infomercials.

Kassie, who was adopted by Lynn and her husband as a baby was diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy. Throughout her young life she has experienced many rough patches,

"We try to have at least four socials

a year, and alternate homes," says Lynn. There is no greater feeling than seeing these wonderful young people interact

It's the story of Kassie and hundreds of children just like her who are pushed aside due to disabilities. This extraordinary must see' documentary has garnered national media and community attention, receiving the "Special Jury Prize" and featured in the AFI Perspective Film Awards 2004, as well as Congressional Coalition Adoption Institute CCAI's Annual Angels in Adoption Awards Celebration in Washington, D.C. GIVEN A CHANCE, A Little Girl's Journey gives credence to the fact we must do our part to make certain disabled people receive the compassion, dignity, faith, equality, friendship, kindness, love and respect they deserve, just like everyone else. When Given A Chance debuted, Kassie's dear friend, veteran actor John Ritter, who for 15 years hosted the United Cerebral Palsy Telethons, volunteered to come on board to support Lynn. Unfortunately, Ritter's life was halted by his untimely death. But as friendship goes, one of Ritter's

best pals, Academy Award winner Billy Bob Thornton gallantly stepped in and took Ritter's place, providing the introduction. Kassie narrates the documentary providing a very unexpected answer to the question: Who wants to adopt a child with a special need?




